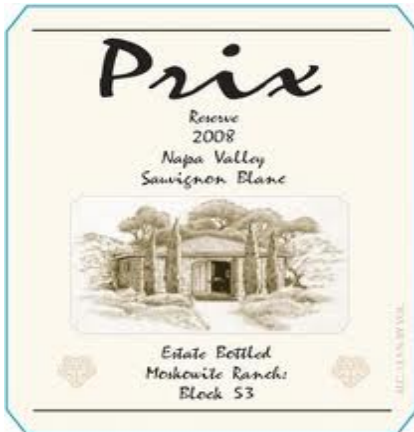

**Hagafen Estate Bottled Napa Valley Syrah, 2009:** On the nose, this Syrah shows aromas of red and black fruits. This inky, dark red wine fills the mouth with firm, meaty tannins. With an extremely long finish, this well-structured Syrah goes well with anything roasted and in need of a wine able to accent and deepen the experience of hearty meat dishes. \$32

### **Hagafen Brut Cuvée Late Disgorged Sparkling Wine 2007**

This elegant bubbly is full, clean, and beautiful.. This beautiful wine is full of prolific small bubbles and has a wonderfully long finish. An extravagance, but in our opinion, worth it \$42 (a personal favorite for special occasions).



**Prix Napa Valley Sauvignon Blanc, 2008** From Hagafen Cellars, we like the crispness of this wine and the citrus flavor. Great with fish or poultry or just to sip and enjoy. \$27

**Hagafen 2012 Sauvignon Blanc**, A Napa Valley Gold Medals International wine competition winner \$21

**Hagafen 2010 Cabernet Sauvignon**, Napa Valley, Estate Gold Medals, Tasters Guild International \$45

**Yarden 2012 Mount Hermon Indigo** with aromatic ripe plum and berry notes, along with hints of spice and cocoa... a medium bodied wine ready to drink now or in 2-3 years. Pairs well with just about any Yom Tov or Shabbos meal \$15

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
